I. CALL TO ORDER

Director, Paul Anchondo called the meeting to order at approximately 5:30 p.m.

IV. STAFF REPORT

- Mr. Anchondo asked the chairman person if he would like to run the meeting. Chairman Jerry Montijo agreed to have Mr. Anchondo run it since he was joining us via Zoom.
- Mr. Price was invited to go over the Summer Programs.
 - Mr. Price gave a description of the Fall programs and statistics.
 - He also went over the upcoming events in the Fall and Summer Programming as follows:
 - Easter Egg Hunt
 - Sports Camps
 - Summer Kick-Off
 - Youth Flag Football League

Mr. Price opened up the floor for any suggestions for the Summer programming from the board:

Board Member Montijo inquired how we can run the softball city leagues more effectively being that he hears complaints about the league being offered during the hot months and the parks being overcrowded with more than 3 teams practicing at once.

Mr. Anchondo clarified the inquiry was about the T-Ball and Coach Pitch league. He also commented it is typically the practice to have two or more teams practicing in the field.

Ex-Officio Sylvia G Rodriguez agreed we do need more baseball fields. Board Member Montijo said he gets complaints from the parents because they are having to share the field with other teams.

Board Member Michael Reeg commented we will always have parents complain about one thing or another. She also inquired about how the intake of volunteers works.

Chad went over the process of how the city leagues are run and how the coaches can volunteer. Other events require the department to seek help from the local community but most of the events and leagues are run by the Parks and Recreation staff.

Board Member Michael Reeg offered her services as a volunteer.

Board Member Ronda Olson asked if the city had an agreement working in collaboration with the local schools to use their ball fields.

Mr. Anchondo informed of the existing IGA with the local Jr. High and High school and a partnership with the local little league. The sharing of the field is already in place and sharing with the schools is an option.

Mr. Anchondo also informed the board that it is hard to justify the need for a bigger field if we don't have the number of participants.

Ex Officio Sylvia G Rodriguez said she likes that we are offering the science night and expressed her concerns with the past movie under the stars being offered during the summer heat. Weather being a problem and also the mosquitos.

Mr. Price acknowledged the problem and agreed with Board Member Majewski's suggestion to look into offering a family movie night in one of the school gyms in the future.

Ex Officio Sylvia G Rodriguez commented the outside is great it just needs to be offered when in cooler weather.

Mr. Price agreed and informed the board the movies under the stars have been changed to the spring and fall months to avoid the summer heat problems

Ex Officio Sylvia G Rodriguez also suggested summer physical activities for families such as mud runs, and obstacle courses involving water. She mentioned AZ City Fire having a water day once a week during the summer months.

Mr. Anchondo informed the board that the current budget for this summer's activities is already in place.

Ex Officio Sylvia G Rodriguez asked if we have thought about adult leagues.

Mr. Price responded he and Maggie are looking into offering a Co-Ed Softball league towards the end of the summer or early fall.

Ex Officio Sylvia G Rodriguez suggested we incorporate businesses to join. She mentioned the Parks and Eloy Fire getting together and playing and the guys enjoying the gatherings. She mentioned it's a good way to promote health and wellness in our community.

Board Member Majewski asked if there will be any cook-offs of any sort in the future.

Ex Officio Sylvia G Rodriguez suggested we obtain an Eloy Chamber calendar but she did not think that was offered this year.

Vice Mayor Dan Snyder informed the board the cook-off was part of the planning but it will not take place this calendar year.

Ex Officio Sylvia G Rodriguez suggested we joined with the Eloy Chamber and plan to incorporate the cook-off since we have more manpower.

She also suggested a senior resource fair be incorporated since she attended one offered by the city of Maricopa in 2019. It was well attended, they served lunch, and part of the speakers were informing the seniors about living wills and others about their population.

Board Member Michaele Reeg mentioned she comes from a small town and they offered a health fair for seniors at the high school. They offered health exams by local doctors and it was very popular and well attended. She also mentioned at the Senior Center she attended in Washington they offered ti-chi for adults and scavenger hunts. They offered insurance agents to come and inform the seniors of medicare options and also educated them about scams.

She suggested we advertise in the paper since that was the practice in Washington. She mentioned she is not aware we have a newspaper here in town in which we can promote the events offered.

Vice Mayor, Dan Snyder asked if it would be easy for vendors to come in and sell without paying sales tax or if we can ask the council to waive the permit fees. Otherwise, we will have a lack of participation when they have to pay permit fees.

Paul Anchondo answered yes we do offer that currently for the Fiestas Patrias in September, Chamber events allow vendors and the Christmas in Eloy as well the cost of \$10.00 for a peddlers license.

Vice Mayor, Dan Snyder was asked if the permit fee can be waived.

Mr. Anchondo informed the \$10.00 fee does not seem to hinder the participation of the vendors.

Mr. Price communicated we have no control over the county health process but there is no fee involved with their paperwork.

He also mentioned the fee has not gotten in the way of the participation and mentioned we had approximately 20 plus vendors for the Electric Light Parade event and had to turn some down because of the lack of space.

Vice Mayor Dan Snyder went on to ask if the taxes would be waived for vendors who would sell arts and crafts.

Board Member Alan Friedman responded the reason for the fees is to be able to have a handle on the number of participants and assigning spaces.

Ex Officio Sylvia G Rodriguez mentioned the Eloy Chamber usually assists the vendors with permit paperwork needed.

Mr. Anchondo informed us there are ways we can make that process as smooth as possible.

Ex Officio Sylvia G Rodriguez moved on to mention the following concerns:

City Hall vehicles were broken into and asked if we can look for security cameras for the parks as well.

Mr. Anchondo mentioned we have an Eloy Webcam in place and Mr. Price went on to mention his experience with those cameras not having a clear picture of who the perpetrator is. This makes it difficult to get PD involved without being able to identify the person on the camera.

Mr. Anchondo said it can be something we can look into it soon.

Ex Officio Sylvia G Rodriguez also informed the board of a skate park panel being broken or missing. The area is collecting trash under it and needs to be cleaned and mentioned it's a safety concern as well because she saw evidence of people going under it to do inappropriate actions.

Mr. Anchondo mentioned the city is in the process of obtaining funding to replace broken ramps at the skate park. It will be a grant and hoping the repairs will help the situation.

Mr. Price asked if some other questions, suggestions, or concerns were not discussed please feel free to email him.

B. Capital Project Update:

Mr. Anchondo informed us of the following Capital Projects are scheduled:

- ADA ramp at Main Street Park Gazebo and replacing the cement in the surrounding area of the gazebo. The project will begin in the next few weeks. The project is funded by CDBG and the cost is \$100,000.00, it's a federal grant fund.
- The replacement of the turf and irrigation at Main Street Park was also approved by the council last week.
- Eloy Aquatic resurfacing project is also on the schedule and it will be taken to the city council to resurface the interior of both swimming pools. This project will be approximately \$60,000.00.
- We also have a couple of pending grants (1) Jones Park improvements- if approved we will be replacing the pool decking as well as the ballfield lights and the skate park equipment. The cost for the skate park alone will cost approximately \$50,000.00. If the funding is not approved he has requested the funding in this year's city budget for the skate park equipment just in case.
- Lastly, we have another pending grant for Shumway Park. The request is to replace the existing playground system and also for an outdoor fitness park. This is a highly competitive grant if approved the city would have to provide a 50% match. The Jones Park grant would be fully funded. Shumway Park is through Land Mark Conservation Park.

V. **BUSINESS:**

- A. Motion to approve minutes for meeting 09-22-2021 was given by Board Member Alan Friedman, Second by Board Member Kalie Majewski. All were in favor and approved.
- B. Jerry Montijo was nominated by board member Majewski to serve as a chairperson for 2022. The motion was second by Board Member Anthony Rodriguez. All were in favor and he was appointed to serve as Chairperson for 2022.
- C. Board Member Ysenia Peña nominated Board Member Kalie Majewski for the Vice-Chairperson for 2022. The motion was second by Board Member Jerry Montijo. All were in favor and she was appointed to serve as Vice Chairperson for 2022.

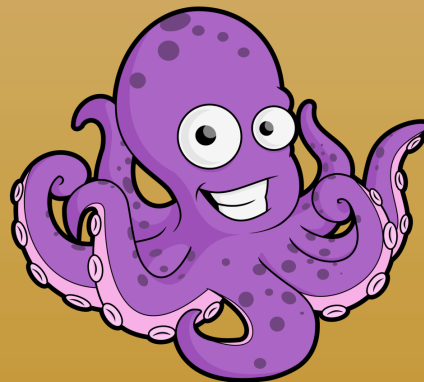

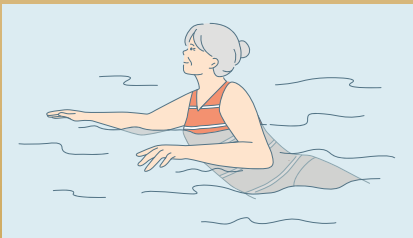
