Chairman, Jerry Montijo called the meeting to order at approximately 5:31 p.m.

Board Members Present: Chairperson-Jerry Olveda, Vice Chairperson-Kylie Majewski, Board Member- Michael Anthony Rodriguez, Board Member-Ronda Olson, Ex Officio Member, Sylvia G Rodriguez.

Board Members Absent: Board Member Yseña Peña, Board Member Alan Friedman, Board Member Michaele Reeg.

IV. REPORT & ANNOUNCEMENTS

Capital Projects Update:

- Mr. Anchondo went over all the completed projects and the pending capital grant projects:
 - The following projects are part of a State Parks grant in the amount of \$ 600,000.00
 - Installation of the new skate park equipment to be installed Oct 2022. Total project cost is over \$244,000.00.
 - Jones Park LED lighting is scheduled to be completed in December 2022. Project cost for that is \$295,000.00.
 - Renovation of the pool decking at the Eloy Aquatic's Center.

Board Member Brenda Olson, asked about the possibility of replacing the splash pad and water slide at the Aquatic's Center. Mr. Anchondo informed her the cost for that replacement would be over \$1 million dollars and we do not have the funding for it. However he did inform her the restrooms had been painted, stalls had been renovated as well as the urinals and some of the toilets.

Chairperson, Jerry Olveda, mentioned the mats at the pool restrooms cause bad odor inside the restrooms. Mr. Anchondo informed him the matting was removed and the floors were re-done.

Vice Chairperson, Kylie Majewski, commented the Aquatic's Center is confusing to enter. There is no signage indicating the entrance. Mr. Anchondo informed her we will look into obtaining better signage.

Chad indicated it's extremely difficult to protect the public restrooms from being vandalized however we don't have as high of a problem like Casa Grande because they are opened from 6:00 am – 11:00 pm.

Mr. Anchondo turned it over to Chad to go over the Summer Activities

Summer Activities Report:

Eloy Swim Team- 33 participants registered:
Great turn out specially since its our first time back since covid.

Kids Summer Camp- over 80 participants registered:
Very successful and busy program.

4th of July Bash and Fireworks Show was at Main Street was had a great turn out as well.

We saw increase of participants this year. We had 180 participants at our Softball League this year.

We had over 89 kids participating on our Swim Lessons program this year.

Over 78 kids participated in our summer dance classes and karate this year.

We are extremely excited for the participation of the teens at the field trips which was 35 kids.

Vice Chair woman, Kylie Majewski, suggested we have young staff to motivate the teens to attend the programs.

Chad informed her we use high school valunteers, he also mentioned we are trying to draw teens from Jr High in hopes that they will gain recreation information and return to work for us when they reach the age requirements.

Chad moved on to inform the comitte of the hard work staff put in to come up with new enovated programs one being

Science Night, where we had the AZ Science Center come out. Also, through the Library we just purchased some stem robotics.

Board Member Anthony Rodriguez indicated he is part of a stem robotic program where you can request robotic programs.

Another successful program was the bird house making. It was a fun project however Vice Chair woman mentioned it was hard to make. Chad agreed the age group will be reconsidered.

Mobile Mini Golf- we set up a 9 Hole Mobile gulf course at Jones Park which we had about 75 participants. This event might be more successful in the fall or spring when the weather is a bit nicer.

We also had a Scavenger Hunt at Main Street Park, it was ran by local business and the Library. It motivated participants to visit local businesses they haven't been and get a clue and move over to the next location.

Fall Actitivity Guide Review:

We partnered with Pinal Central and Eloy Enterprise to provide this new look. It was a very cost effective choice for us. We were also able to increase our distribution. We would normally print 250-300 copies however this route we were able to get 3000 at about a 3rd of the cost. We invision continuing this route in the future.

Eloy Library is very busy with programming. Aside from the normal operations. We also have some financial classes being offered however they were not well attended.

We have also partnered with UOA cooperative extension we will be offereing some other courses such as parenting classes.

Eloy After School Program: This program had been housed at the cafeteria at Curiel School for the past 15 plus years. This year it's been moved to Troy Thomas Center. It's been a good change and we have 42 kids averaging 20-22 kids per day.

We also introduced a Funtastic Friday program at Troy Thomas center. We have seen much success in the program averaging about 25 kids per day.

Teen Activities: We had a movie night where we took the teens to a holloween movie. We took 11 teens. We also have a gulf fieldtrip planned during the Spring.

Senior Activities: The center is opened 8:30am - 2:30pm every day. We offer a variety of activities and 2 meals per day. On Friday's we offer crafts, bingo and different field Trips.

Youth sports: We are currently taking registrations for Flag Football and concluding Soccer. We surpassed last year's participants by at least 23 for soccer. Flag Fooball will be following right after.

Special Events: We have a Movie Under the Stars this Saturday at 7:30 pm. and we take a break from the movies until the Spring.

We have our Annual Harvest Festival this month, one of our larger events at Main Street Park with carnival rides, contests, trunk or treat area, food and music.

In December we have our Electric Light Parade and Christmas in Eloy Event. This largest event will take place Dec. 10th also at Main Street Park.

We also have a Motown Music at Main Street Park scheduled for March 24th at 6:30 pm.

Our general events such as MLK, Father Daughter Banquet, Easter those are also listed in the guide.

Vice Chair woman Kylie Majewski, inquired about the Mom and Son banquet since we offer a Father Daughter Banquet. Chad will consider it for the future.

Chairman, Jerry Olvera inquired about the carnival rides for the Harvest Festival. Asking if we will have more because of the long lines.

Mr. Anchondo, informed him the price of the rides sky rocket it because of covid.

Parks & Recreation Fee Review:

Following the request from our last meeting regarding the fees. He mentioned this is a city wide effort.

Mr. Anchondo went over the fees for public swim for Eloy as well as the local pinal county cities.

He also went over the Swim Lesson fees for Eloy, Coolidge and Town of Florence as well as City of Casa Grande.

Also, he went over the fees for Pool Rental for Eloy as well as all the surrounding cities. Suggesting Eloy add's a Non-resident fee. Eloy is looking to possibly raise the fees for the pool in the future since its lower than the surrounding cities.

All the new fees will likely come into effect our next fiscal year in July 2023.

Facility Rentals; Toltec Community Center currently rents at \$10.00 per hour which will be re-evaluated and increased in the near future.

Troy Thomas being 50 for the first 2 hours and 20 each additional hour. He also read the local city's facility rental fees.

He also read the Camp registrations which will likely increase as well.

Sport League registrations are looking to increase as well since we are the least expenses. We are looking to increase but we don't want to increase not make it affordable for the community.

Mr. Anchondo addressed Ex-Officio Member Sylvia G Rodriguez whom arrived at 6:06pm. pointing out to the fee comparison suggesting she calls him with any questions.

Board Member Ronda Olson inquired about a tour of the facilities here in Eloy since she lives at Robson Ranch and would like to get other together for a tour our the facilities in the near future.

She also offered to speak to someone at the golf course at Robson in hopes they will donate something for one of our golf events.

She also informed us she would like pickle ball set up. Mr. Anchondo informed the committee we have a net at Shumway Park.

Ex-Officio Member Sylvia G Rodriguez asked about the capital projects. Mr. Anchondo went over the already mentioned projects above.

Ex-Officio Member asked how we can prevent from damaging the new equipment at the skate park once it's installed. Mr. Anchondo informed that we have installed security cameras at the aquatic center and they are facing the Jones Park and the Skate Park and contact with PD has been made in hope that the area can be more patrolled to help prevent any vandalism.

Chairperson Jerry Montijo, asked if the park can possibly be closed by 8:00 pm instead of the current time. Mr. Anchondo mentioned it's more of a patrol issue and we would have to change the hour of operation set by city ordinance.

Ex-Officio recommended adding signage fictitious signs indicating camera's are operating to attempt to prevent criminals from committing vandalism.

Ex-Officio also inquired about the gym equipment grant. Mr. Anchondo informed her the grant had been processed and is awaing a respond.

Vice Chair woman Kylie Majewski, recommended we look into offering drum cardio. She mentioned it's geared towards young moms and it's very fun. Chad informed her we have offered numerous of different fitness classes and have not had a good turn out. Kylie suggested we make connection with a health club that will offer health shakes in exchange for the classes so that we don't have to pay an instructor fee.

Ex-Officio Member Sylvia G Rodriguez, suggested we have an open gym geared towards the children that age out from attending our programs. This will provide them with a place to go and get out of the house and during the summer get out of the heat. She recommended making a connection with the schools and hopes we can make it happen.

Chad, informed her in the past the schools did not operate the AC units during the closed seasons. Mr. Anchondo inquired about the Jr. High having an AC unit since in the past it was a swamp cooler. Chairperson Jerry Montijo, confirmed they had just installed a brand new AC unit.

Mr. Anchondo said we are more than willing to reach out the Jr High and see if we can make it happen.

Ex-Officio Member Sylvia G Rodriguez, updated the comitte about the Community Development updating the City of Eloy generals plans.

One being the expansion of picacho heights boundries and residential community on Arica Rd/Sunshine Blvd. As we are growing this is a opportunity for expansion of parks. How are we

going to accommodate the expansion? She is inquiring if the Community Services Department have a currentl 5 year master plan? She suggested we share the plan with the committee to be better prepared for the growth.
